


News from Parish Council Meeting this Past Thursday

- 1) We are carefully planning a robust **in-person Church School Program**, that will offer some online components for kids who stay home. Stay tuned for more details! We will not start this program until late September or early October.
- 2) **Outdoor Coffee Hour** will formally commence next Sunday, August 23. Stay tuned for details on plans and procedures.
- 3) Our treasurer, Dr. Laura Walther, announces we are very close to **"making budget"** for our 2019-2020 year. Thank you for your faithfulness so far in this year! Our fiscal and ecclesiastical year ends on August 31. **Please help end the year on a strong note!**
- 4) Our **Annual Parish Meeting** for 2020-2021 (*during which we are statutorily required to elect the parish council and confirm a parish budget*) will be held on Sunday, September 27. Due to Covid, our reports will be sent out in video and/or pdf format. Our treasury/budget discussion will take place via Zoom; but our voting will take place in-person, on both floors of the church, on Sept. 27 (abbreviated to about 10-15 minutes.)
- 5) For our **Parish Council 2020-2021, we have three open seats.** Alina Rizea is rotating off council, and Chris Reeves (our warden) and Laura Walther (our treasurer) are willing to serve again. So far, we have received one nomination, Jason McCord, to also serve on council for a 3-year term. If there are any other nominations to stand for the 3 open seats, please reach out to Fr. Justin before September 1.
